The color tone of the picture leans towards warm colors, rendering the solemnity of the founding ceremony. Secondly, script creation reflects a rigorous examination of historical details. The screenwriting team went deep into the archives to search for historical materials and selected important historical nodes such as Mao Zedong's reading of the founding words and Zhu De's inspection of the troops as the narrative focus. The dialogue between the characters has been carefully designed, retaining the historical essence while highlighting the personality traits of revolutionary leaders. In terms of the cast, Gu Yue, who plays Mao Zedong, pays attention to detailed portrayal in her performance, striving to restore the leader's style from her eyes, tone to every move and gesture. Once again, the art production team meticulously reconstructed the historical scene. Art director Zhang Shuping led a team to review a large number of historical photos and documents, and accurately reconstructed the layout of the Tiananmen Gate Tower. Fashion designers, based on historical records, created clothing that was in line with the characteristics of each historical figure at that time, reflecting the features of that era. The props team rigorously verified the details of the flags, badges, and other items used in the founding ceremony. Finally, the post production of the film showcases the artistic charm of the red cultural genes. The editor used montage techniques to interweave the scenes of the founding ceremony and the revolutionary process, enhancing the infectious power of historical narrative. The music composed by the music director uses symphonic elements with revolutionary characteristics to create a solemn historical atmosphere. The sound designer has a unique approach to the sound effects of historical scenes, creating a breathtaking auditory effect.

1.1.2 Character Building

The movie portrays heroic characters with red genes, showcasing noble spiritual qualities and revolutionary spirit. For example, in the movie "Jiao Yulu", the creative team deeply shaped the protagonist's spiritual image from multiple dimensions. The film selects important scenes from Jiao Yulu's tenure as the secretary of the Lankao County Party Committee, showcasing the noble character of a Communist Party member through delicate artistic techniques. Firstly, the design of camera language embodies a unique artistic pursuit. The photography team adopted a documentary approach and focused on capturing the scene of the protagonist delving deep into the grassroots: his firm footsteps as he crossed the sand dunes, his focused expression as he studied the desertification control plan, and his warm smile as he visited impoverished households. The photography director used handheld photography techniques to capture images of the protagonist walking into the village and inspecting the sandy terrain. The close-up shot focuses on capturing the eye contact between the protagonist and the masses during conversation, showcasing the people's feelings of Communist Party cadres. Secondly, performing arts highlight the spiritual connotation in character portrayal. The lead actor pays attention to detail in the performance design, carefully designing both the walking posture

and the tone of speech. For example, the slightly forward leaning posture when walking reflects the cadre's deep involvement with the masses, and the gentle yet firm tone when speaking demonstrates care for the masses. The production team focuses on showcasing the scene where the protagonist endures the pain of liver disease while still persevering in work, such as clenching his fists during an outbreak of illness, beads of sweat oozing from his forehead, and an expression of enduring pain while persevering in work. These details vividly demonstrate the noble spirit of a Communist Party member. Thirdly, the clothing design highlights the simple image of grassroots cadres, such as washed Zhongshan suits that turn white, dusty cloth shoes, and worn briefcases. The prop design highlights the harsh working environment, such as a desk filled with documents, a notebook filled with notes, and a worn bicycle. Fourthly, the sound and painting design deepens the portrayal of character spirit. Editing art intertwines the scenes of the protagonist's work and illness, creating a strong contrast between the mental state of visiting the masses and the images of enduring illness at night. Fifthly, the performances of the extras demonstrate a profound friendship between the Party and the masses. The old farmer dressed plainly and passionately recounted his experience in desertification control, the woman tearfully recounted the changes in her life, and the child naively called out 'Uncle Secretary'. These performance details vividly illustrate the flesh and blood connection between the Party and the people.

1.2 Visual Symbols

1.2.1 Red Imagery

Red, as a symbol of revolution, has been widely used in Chinese language films, with visual elements such as the red flag and red scarf becoming important symbols for expressing the red gene in movies. For example, in the movie "Sparkling Red Star", the art creation team integrated red elements into the narrative structure, forming a systematic visual symbol system. Secondly, the imagery of the red flag plays an important role in combat scenes. The art team carefully designed the texture and size of the red flag, such as the red flag in the hands of guerrilla fighters made of coarse cloth, reflecting the arduous style of the revolutionary team; The large red flag fluttering on the hill is grand in size, demonstrating the strength of revolutionary forces. The red flag occupies an important position in the composition of the picture: in the battle scene, the red flag is located above the picture, symbolizing the victory of the revolutionary cause; During the mass rally, red flags surrounded the venue, demonstrating the power of the revolutionary masses. Finally, the imagery of the red star runs through the entire film. The art director cleverly incorporated red star elements in multiple scenes, such as the flickering red star in the night sky guiding the direction of revolution, the red star on the military

cap symbolizing the identity of revolutionary soldiers, and the red star on the classroom wall symbolizing the inheritance of revolutionary ideals. The light of the red star presents a changing effect under different lighting conditions, such as the red star at dawn symbolizing the bright prospects of the revolutionary cause, and the red star in the midst of war demonstrating the firm will of the revolution.

1.2.2 Scene Settings

The movie strives to recreate historical scenes and revolutionary holy sites, creating a strong red atmosphere. For example, in the movie "Jinggangshan", the creative team's interpretation of the red gene is reflected in every scene detail. The art department, based on rigorous historical research, carefully restored the important historical scenes of the revolutionary base in Jinggangshan. Firstly, the scene design of Zhu Mao's meeting highlights the solemnity of historical turning points. The art team restored the historical environment of the Maoping site based on historical records: the old thatched roof showcased the harsh conditions of the revolutionary base, the wooden long table reflected the simple style of the revolutionaries, and the revolutionary slogans on the walls highlighted the spirit of struggle. Every detail in the scene has been carefully verified, striving to restore historical authenticity. Secondly, the display of the interior scene of the octagonal building presents the working environment of revolutionary leaders. The prop master equipped this important scene with items that match the characteristics of the era: battle maps and war reports were placed on the office desk, a topographic map of the Jinggangshan area was hung on the wall, and oil lamps and stationery were placed at the corners of the desk, creating a tense revolutionary atmosphere. The prop team has conducted strict verification on each display item to ensure the authenticity of history.

1.3 Emotional Resonance

1.3.1 Music Rendering

The music creation of the movie has formed a unique artistic value, and the music design deeply interprets the spiritual connotation of the red gene. For example, in the movie 'The Red Detachment of Women', the creative team used diverse musical language to create a classic example of revolutionary themed films. Firstly, the theme music creation highlights the artistic expression of revolutionary spirit. The composer used grand symphonic instruments and brass instruments to play a powerful main melody, showcasing the heroic spirit of the female warriors on Qiongya. The carefully arranged percussion instruments create a tense and intense fighting atmosphere. The lyrical melody of the string group depicts the deep emotions of the soldiers towards the revolutionary cause. Secondly, the creation of lyrics highlights the spiritual realm of revolutionaries. The lyrics of the theme song "Red Detachment of Women" are simple and powerful, with every word being precise, such as "moving forward, moving forward, the responsibility of soldiers is heavy, women's grievances are deep, smashing iron chains, turning over and causing revolution...", demonstrating the firm belief of female soldiers in pursuing liberation. Our women's army, carrying guns for the people... "expresses the high fighting spirit of revolutionary soldiers who bravely move forward, and these lyrics have become an important carrier for the inheritance of the red gene. Thirdly, the use of ethnic music elements

highlights regional characteristics. The music composition incorporates the melodic characteristics of the Li ethnic music in Hainan, using ethnic instruments such as bamboo flutes and coconut palms to create a rich South China Sea atmosphere. The music arrangement absorbs the tonal characteristics of folk songs and closely integrates revolutionary spirit with national culture. Finally, the orchestration design formed a unique musical style.
